

Community Profile: Deep River

The Town of Deep River is one of the most unique communities in Canada. Well known for its beautiful landscapes, it is also home to one of only four Canadian nuclear plants. With a population of just over 4,000, the town was originally established as a planned community, funded by the federal government and designed by McGill University.

The town takes its name from being located along one of the deepest parts of the Ottawa River. Residents enjoy waterfront views and a high-quality lifestyle typical of the Ottawa Valley. Access to water sports, hiking, beaches, trails, and continued affordability make it an appealing place to live. Situated at the edge of Algonquin Park, the area attracts tourists from around the world, particularly those looking to paddle the spectacular Barron Canyon. The community is enriched by cultural activities such as farmers' markets, the Canadian Clock Museum, and local artisan co-ops. Deep River is one of the smallest towns in Canada to boast a symphony orchestra.

The main industry is Chalk River Nuclear Laboratories, which includes Canadian Nuclear Laboratories and multiple supporting businesses and programs tied to the nuclear energy sector. This industry is thriving, with a ten-year capital investment project underway that will bring infrastructure improvements and an expanded workforce. Many residents are also employed by the Canadian Armed Forces at CFB Petawawa and by the Canadian Forest Service, which manages the Petawawa Research Forest.

Unlike many rural Canadian towns, Deep River is poised for continued growth. It's rare blend of advanced science, technology, and natural beauty makes it a truly remarkable place to live.












These graphs display the highest-ranked industries based on workplace status at the 5digit NOCS classification in Renfrew and Lanark Counties.
